Johann Wilhelm and Friederike Neldner and their children Auguste, Julius, Ernstine, and Alwine emigrated from the village of Pruszkowo near Rakwitz, Provinz Posen, kingdom of Prussia, embarking at the port of Hamburg on the barque "Sophie" on the 26th June 1858. After a voyage of 118 days they arrived at Port Adelaide, province of South Australia, on the 21st October 1858.

They settled first at Parrot Hill near Gnadenberg (Hill of Grace) and in 1862 purchased section 821, Hundred of Moorooroo, County Light, in that area.

In 1866 Johann Wilhelm Neldner was naturalized as a British subject and in the same year sold his land at Parrot Hill and purchased section 556, Hundred of Nuriootpa, County Light, between Tanunda and New Mecklenburg (now Gomersal) on the western ridge of the Barossa.

On this section Johann Wilhelm and Friederike established their homestead and commenced the agricultural activities which they were to pursue for the remainders of their lives.

JOHANN WILHELM AND FRIEDERIKE NELDER AND THEIR CHILDREN AUGUSTE, JULIUS, ERNESTINE AND ANNE EMIGRATED FROM THE VILLAGE OF DRESDEN, NEAR LEIPZIG, PROVINCE POSEN, KINGDOM OF PRUSSIA, LEAVING AT THE PORT OF BAMBERG ON THE BARQUE 'SOUTH' ON THE 26th JUNE 1855 AFTER A VOYAGE OF 116 DAYS THEY ARRIVED AT FORT ALFREY, PROVINCE OF SOUTH AUSTRALIA, ON THE 21st OCTOBER, 1855.

THEY SETTLED FIRST AT FORT MILES NEAR ONDERSBERG (HILL OF GRAVE) AND IN 1856 PURCHASED SECTION 421, HUNDRED OF MOOROOBROO, COUNTY LIGHT, IN THAT AREA. IN 1866 JOHANN WILHELM NELDER WAS NATURALIZED AS A BRITISH SUBJECT AND IN THE SAME YEAR SOLD HIS LAND AT FORT MILES AND PURCHASED SECTION 456, HUNDRED OF NINDOONIA, COUNTY LIGHT, BETWEEN YANDINA AND NEW MACDONALD GROW COMESAD ON THE WESTERN RIDGE OF THE BAROSSA.

ON THIS SECTION JOHANN WILHELM AND FRIEDERIKE ESTABLISHED THEIR HOMESTEAD AND COMMENCED THE AGRICULTURAL ACTIVITIES WHICH THEY WENT TO PURSUE FOR THE REMAINDER OF THEIR LIVES.

THIS MEMORIAL WAS ERECTED BY DESCENDANTS OF JOHANN WILHELM AND FRIEDERIKE NELDER AS A LASTING TRIBUTE TO HONOUR THEIR MEMORY AND TO COMMEMORATE THE 100th ANNIVERSARY OF THEIR ARRIVAL IN THE PROVINCE OF SOUTH AUSTRALIA.
